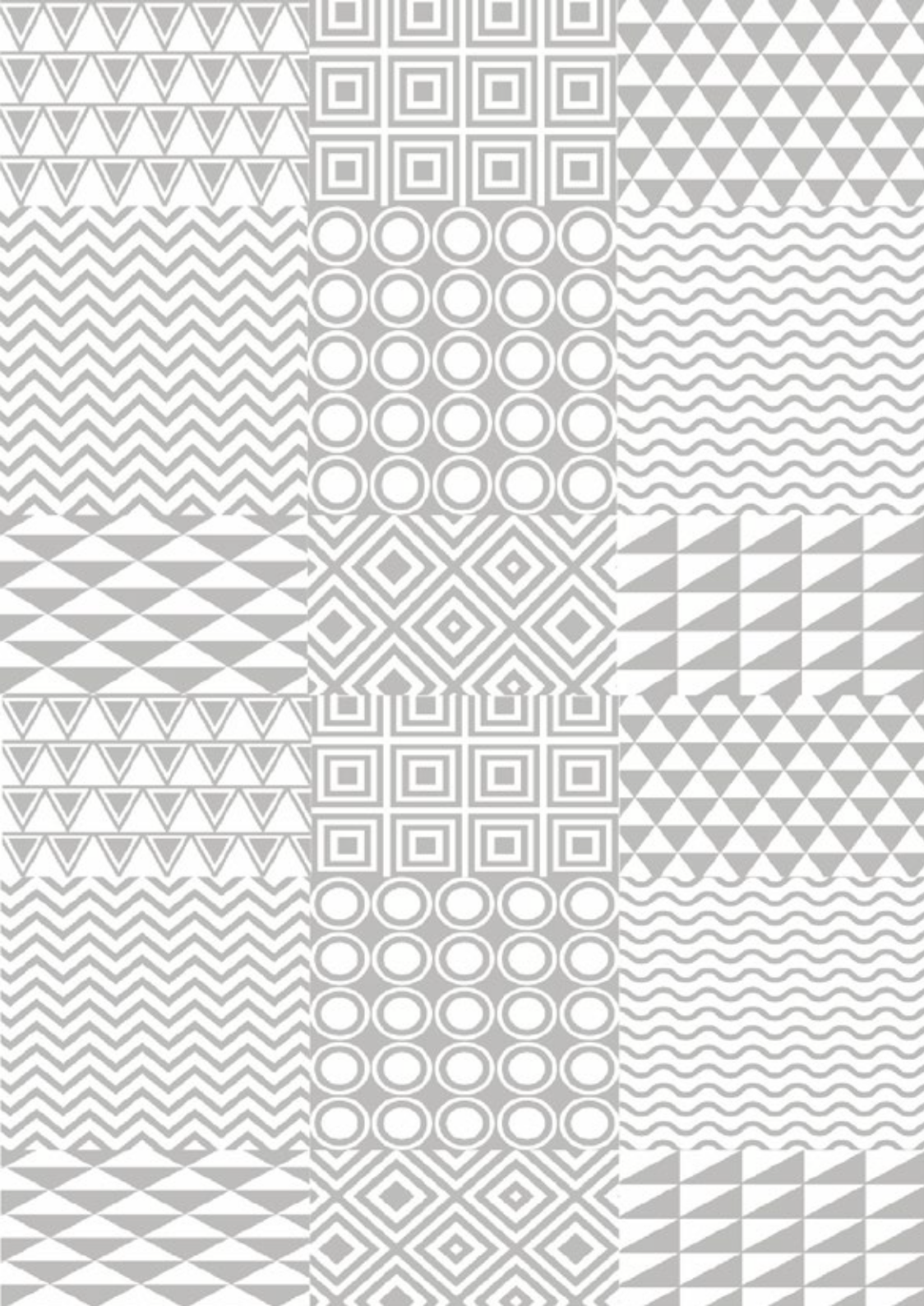


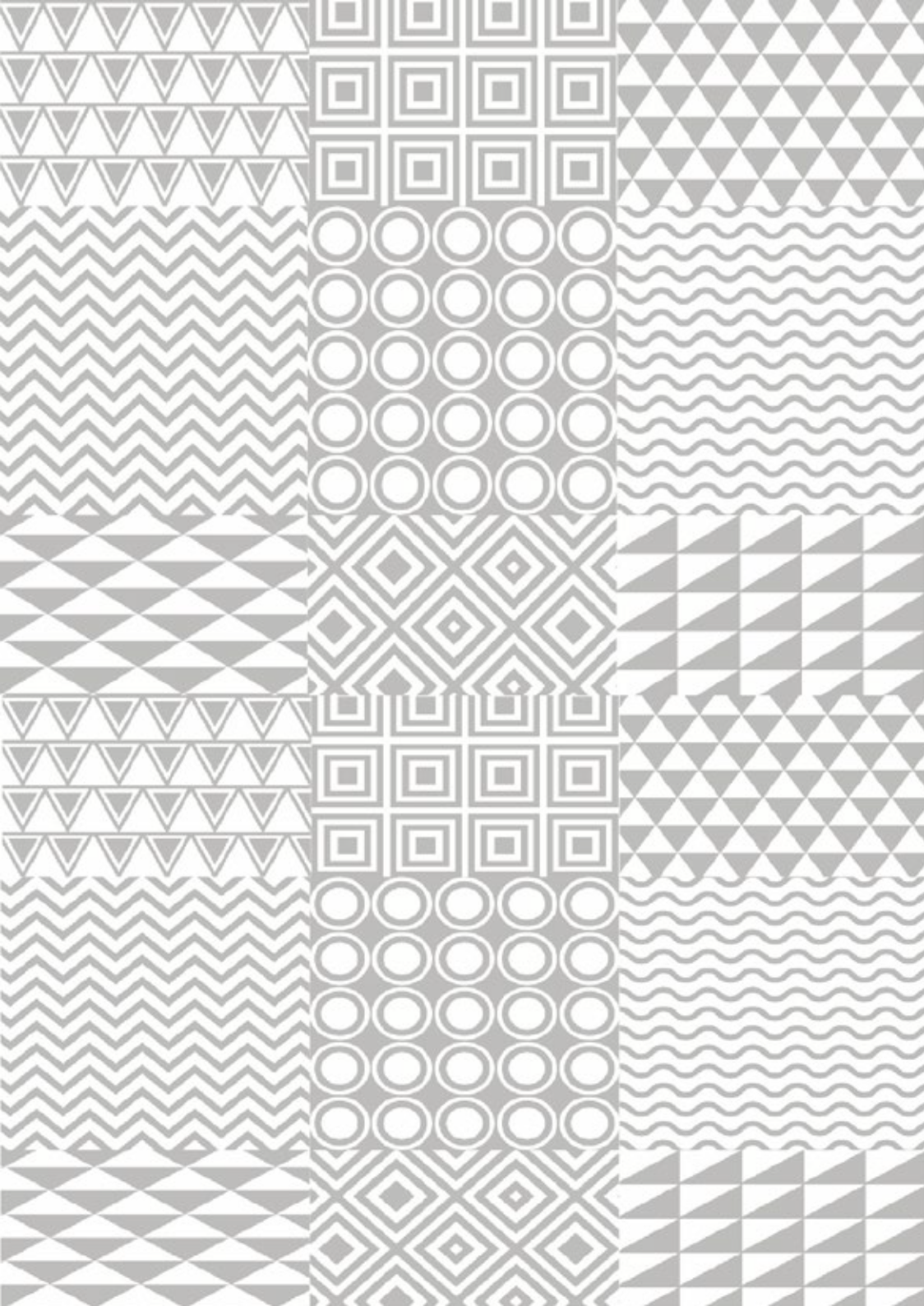

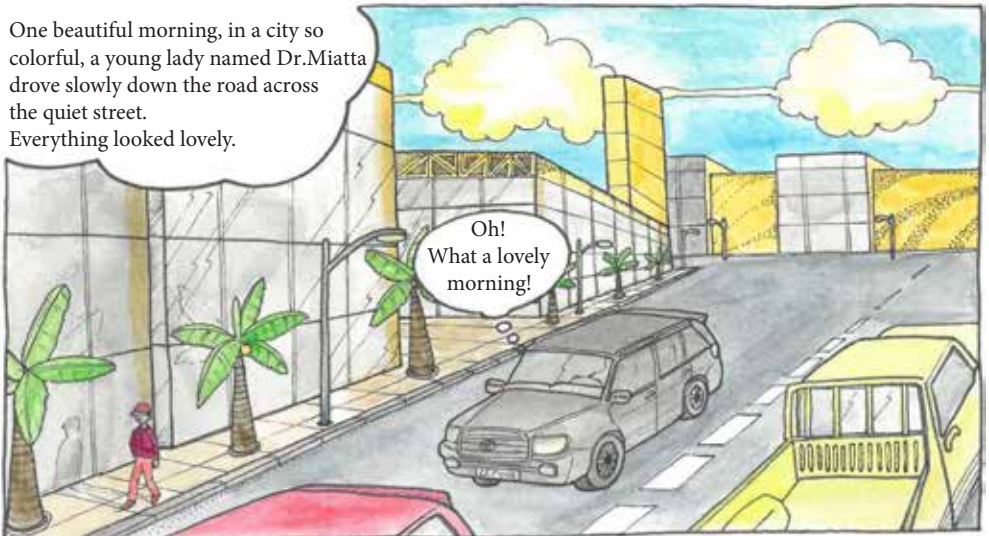

He then took Miatta to meet the students.





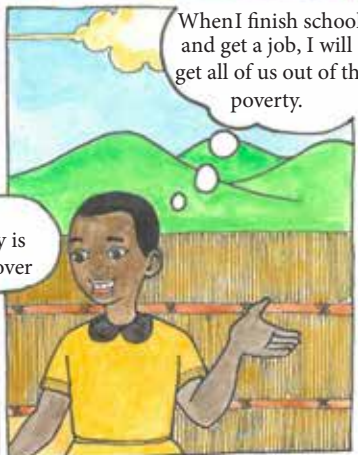
She narrated.....

When I finish school and get a job, I will get all of us out of this poverty.

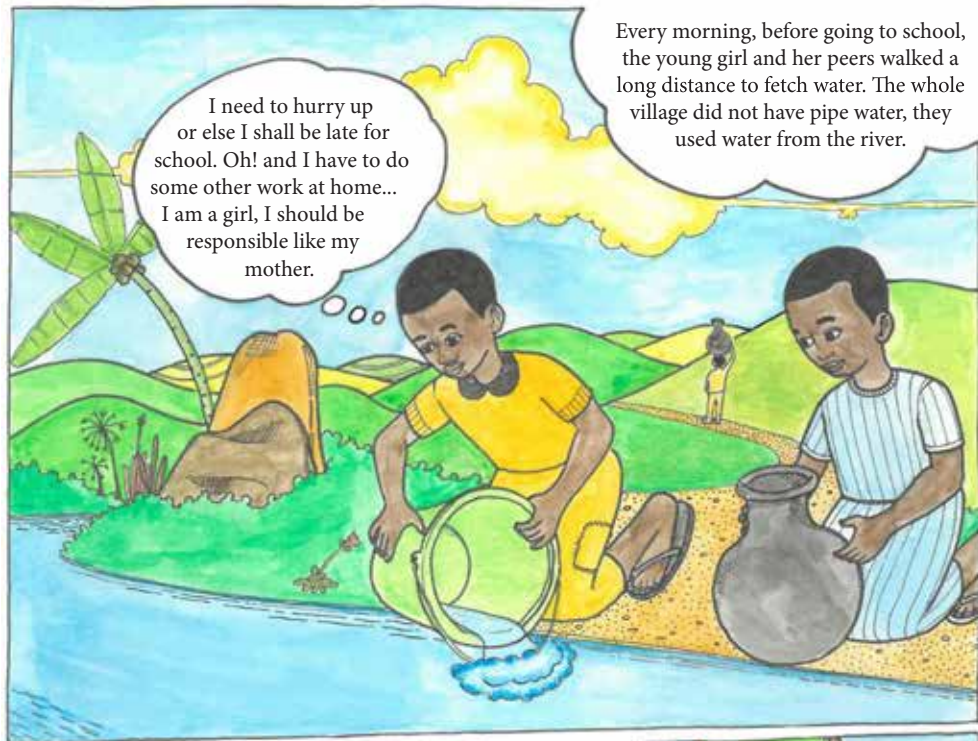


And I wish to change the community through Scientific inventions.



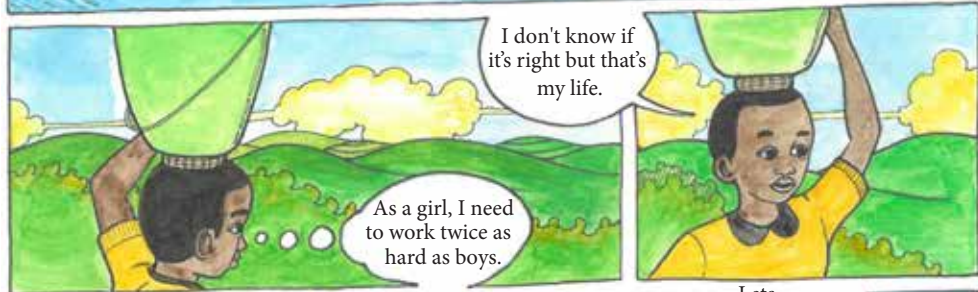
My dream is to study hard and become a Scientist.

As a girl, I need to work twice as hard as boys.



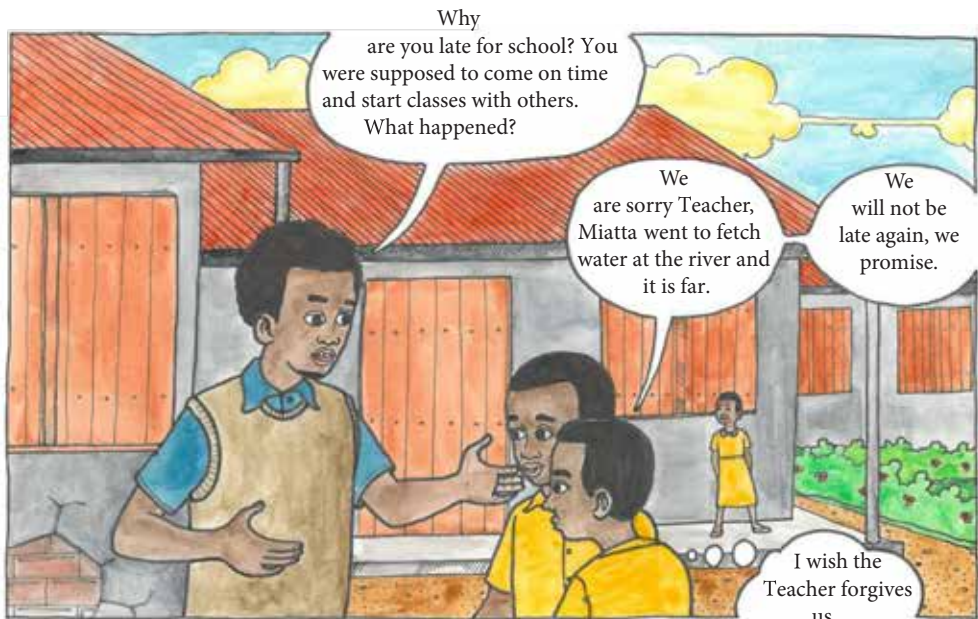
My brothers can't help, they are boys.

After doing all the work, she would join her brothers to go to school.

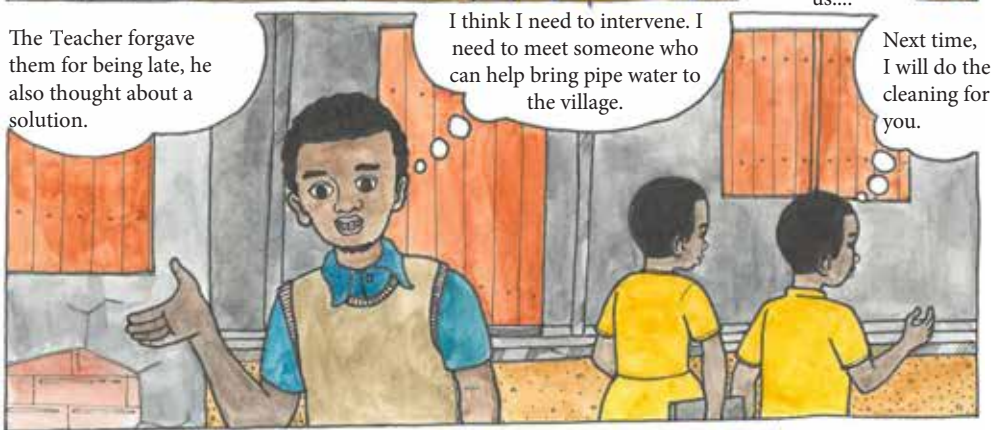


Lets hurry up, we are late for school.

Yes you are right.

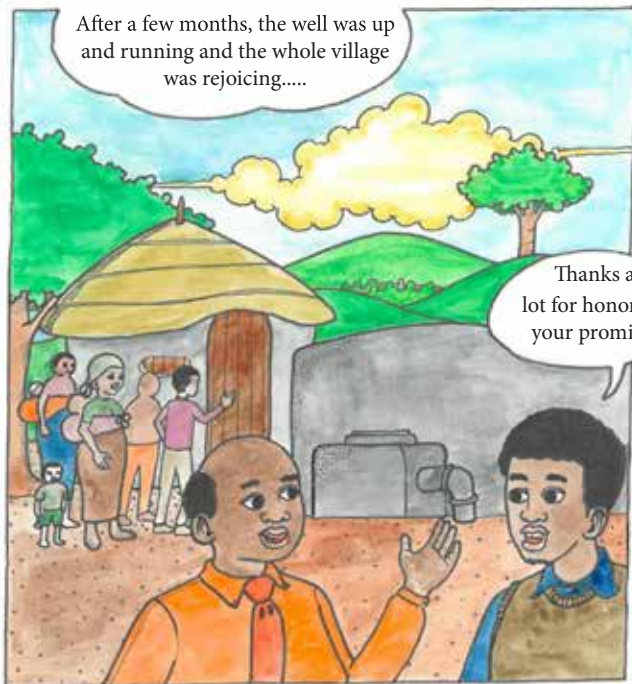


The Teacher forgave them for being late, he also thought about a solution.

We shall never be late for school again....

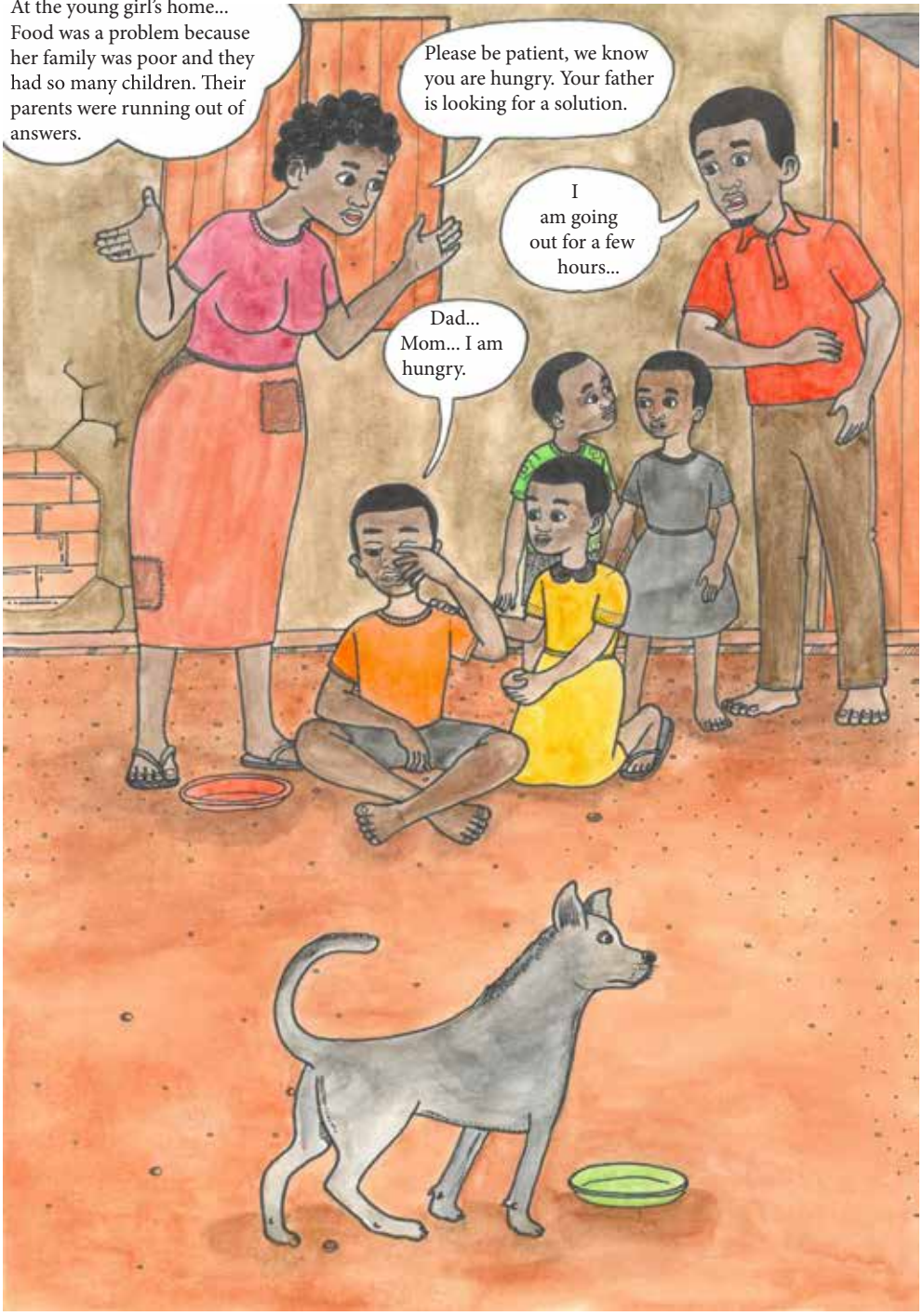


At the young girl's home...

Let's patiently wait for your father. He will come back with something.

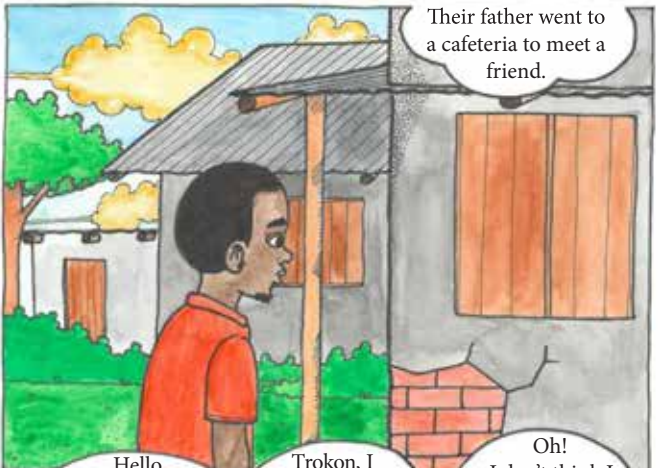
Let me see if I can get something...

Their father went to a cafeteria to meet a friend.



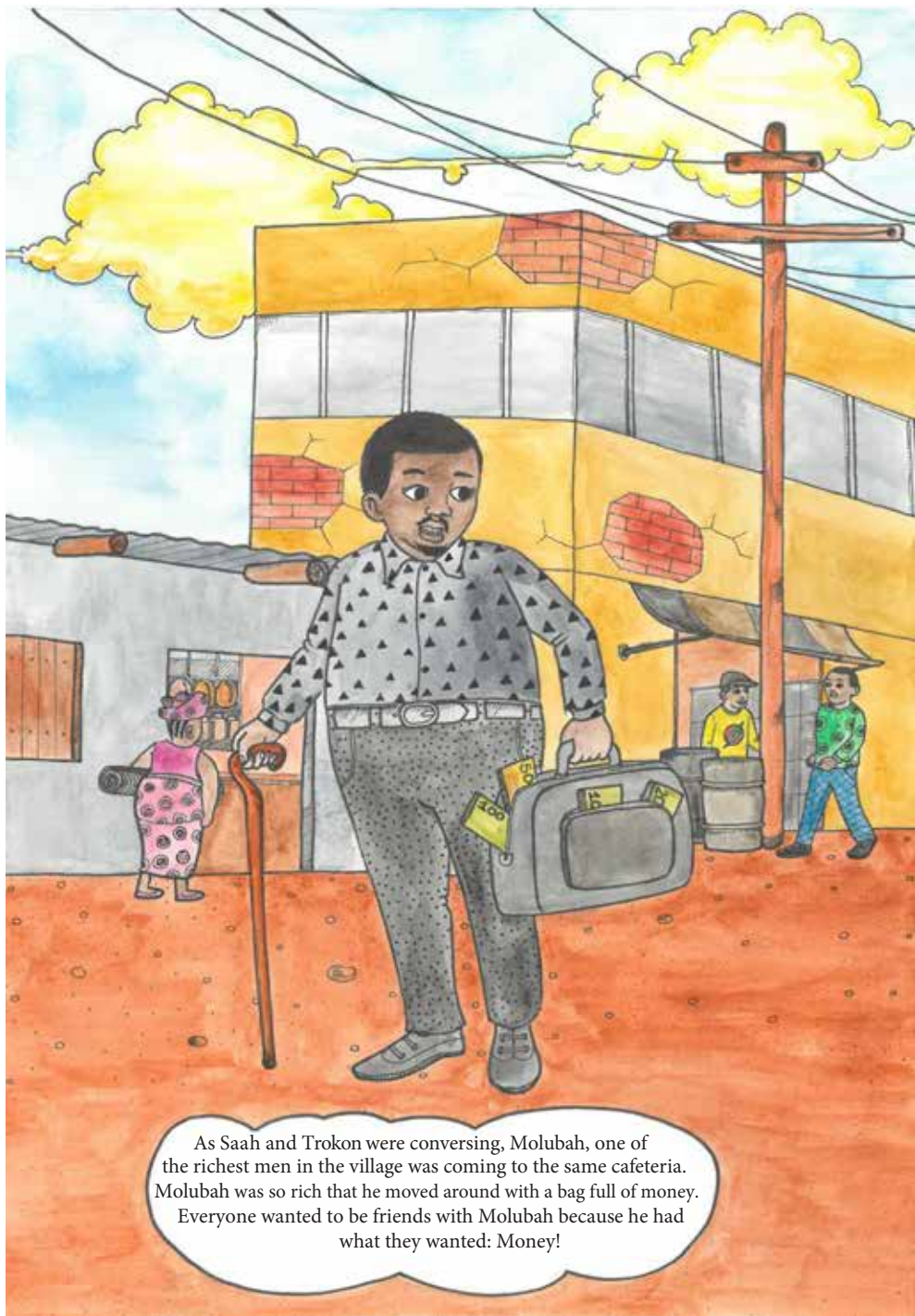
Hello Trokon, can I talk to you for a minute?

Hello Saah! No worries at all, what do you want to tell me..

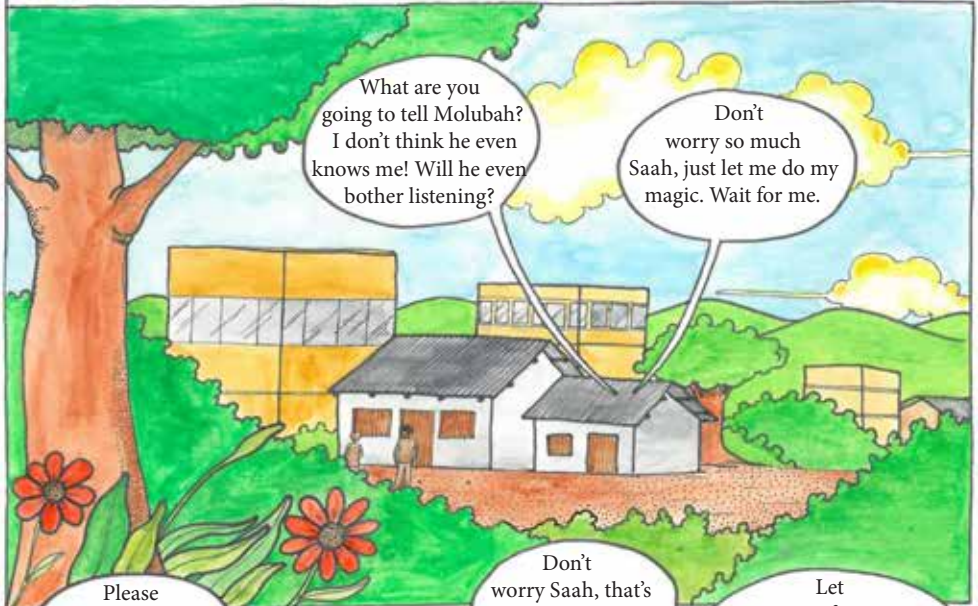
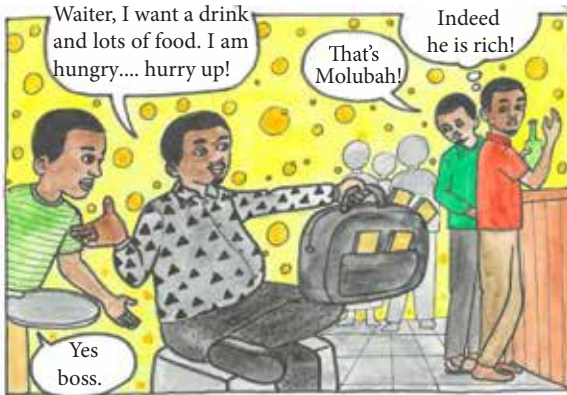
Trokon, I need to borrow some money from you.

Molubah decided to talk to Saah himself

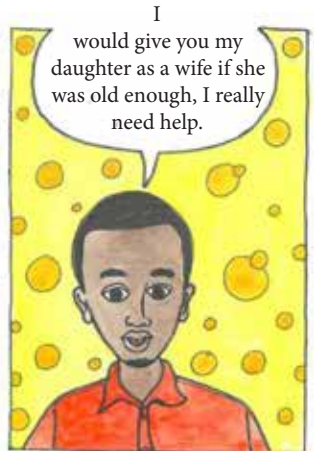


Trokon, you said you trust your friend Saah?

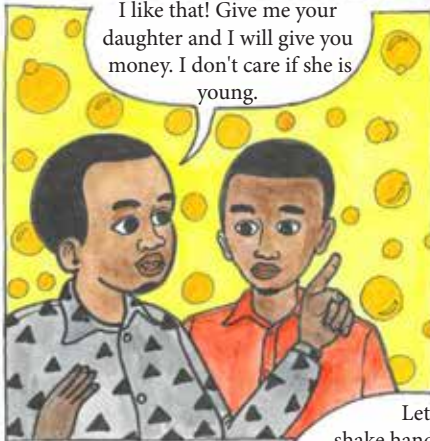
I am an honest man, I will repay you your money.

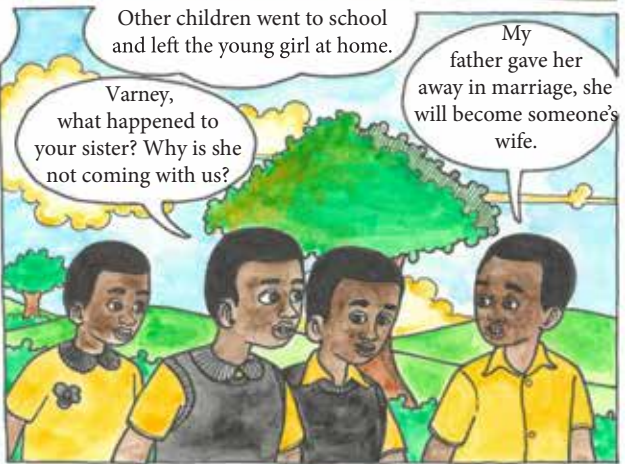


The young girl didn't know that her father had betrayed her rights; her future.



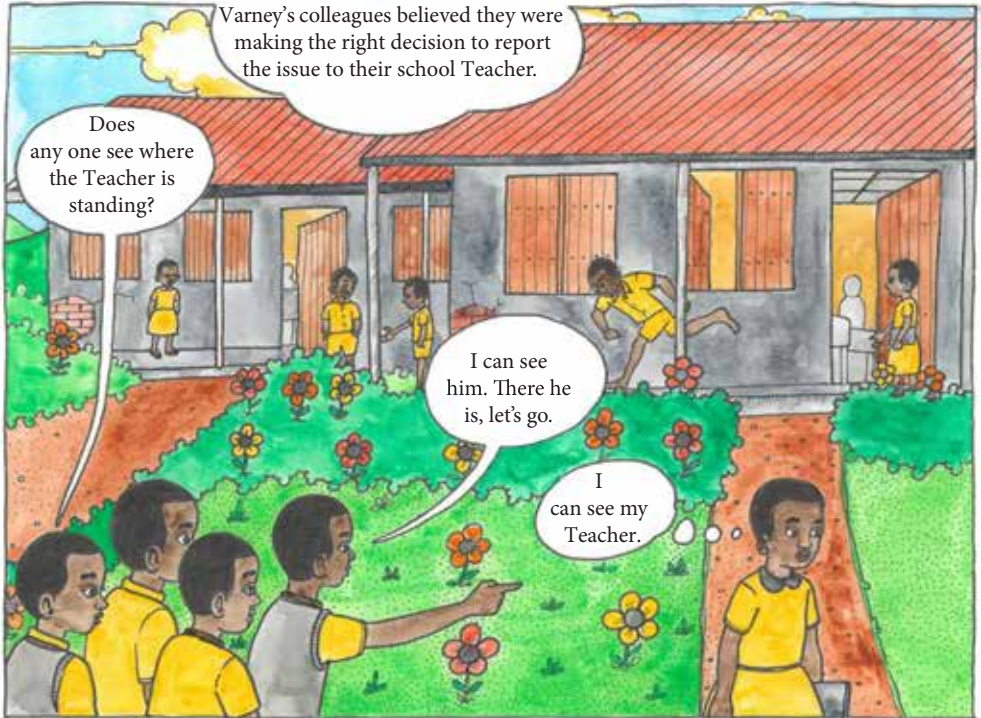
The following morning...

Meanwhile ..... someone else was going to the girl's house.



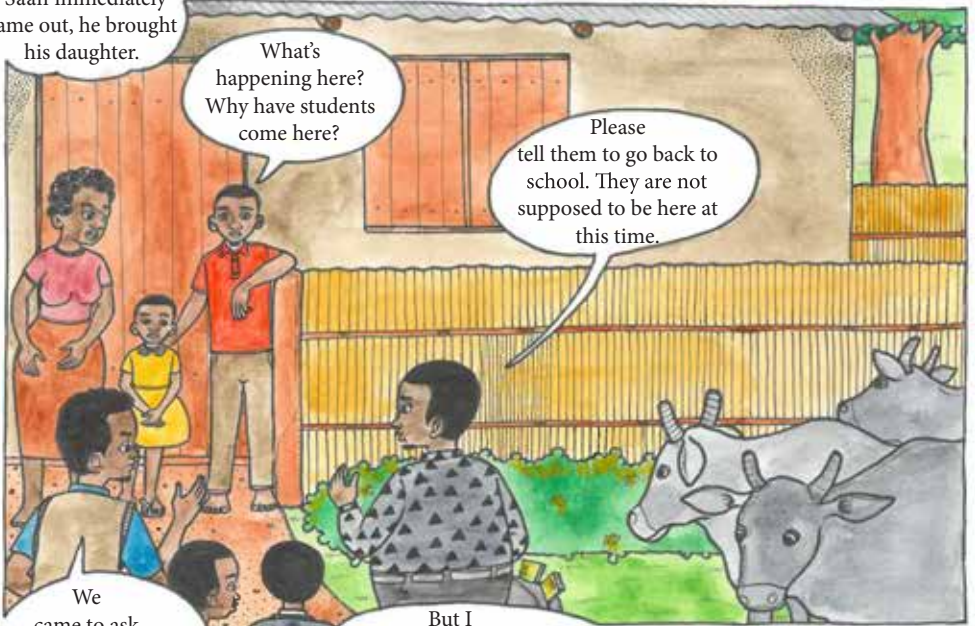
It was Molubah... He had the dowry.

You're welcome.

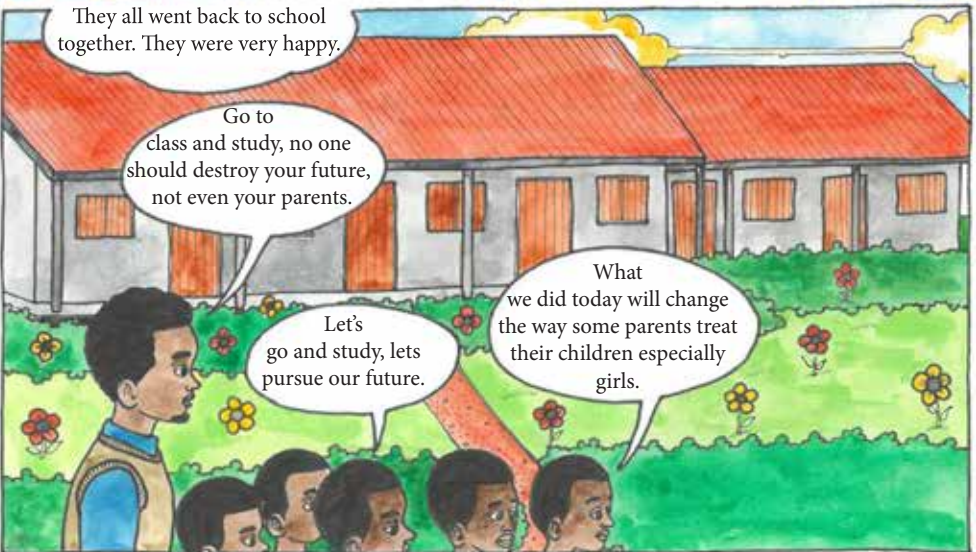


They all went back to school together. They were very happy.
